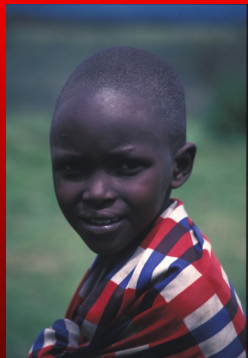

Literacy for the Maasai

The Maasai are an indigenous semi nomadic group of people in Kenya. They are well known for their ability to farm successfully in desert and scrublands. The Maasai are monotheistic, and they call God *Enkai* or *Engai*. Engai is a single deity with a dual nature: Engai Narok (Black God) is benevolent, and Engai Nanyokie (Red God) is vengeful. Many Maasai have converted to Christianity.

Although the Maasai Bible has been in use since 1992, few people are able to read it. Illiteracy levels are as high as 50% amongst the Maasai people. The Bible Society will partner with other agencies to establish adult literacy programs where participants will learn to read and write through the use of Bible based materials. Lessons on health and agriculture will also be included. Funding is required for training 20 literacy teachers, the establishment of 20 classes and materials for 200 students.
